



Background

In Hong Kong, about 40% of the land area is protected as Country Parks and nature reserves. This protected landscape provides an ideal environment for Hong Kong's native plants and wildlife. Forest animals are found throughout these natural wilderness areas. They were here at least 6000 years ago. Barking deer, wild boar, porcupines, leopard cats and civets were some of the early inhabitants of Hong Kong. However, many are nocturnal and extremely shy or secretive avoiding all contact with humans. Observing their presence is extremely challenging for both professionals and the general public.



Objective

Kadoorie Farm and Botanic Garden has set-up a number of infra-red video camera systems within our "protected area" to observe and record the behavior patterns of these wonderful creatures that live in our spectacular forests.

A "Wildlife in Kadoorie Farm and Botanic Garden" VCD has been produced so that people in Hong Kong may understand and perhaps learn to cherish the many forest animals that thrive and continue to live undisturbed in their natural habitats.
